3. Constitutional revision, by Mike Knowles and Ray Fowler

Frese comments briefly the procedure followed in the BOD meeting to generate an updated constitution, based on the past constitution and Knowles and Fowler reacted to questions expressed by one attendee. The constitution was approved unanimously.

4. ICAP: 2006 (Athens), 2010 (Melbourne) by Jim Georgas & Paul Martin

Elias Besevetgis comments on present developments in the organization and program. 2<sup>nd</sup> announcement to be made public online and offline through printed copies. In a similar vein comments about work in progress regarding the 27 ICAP were summed up.

5. Questions from the floor: Dr. Solc introduces the interest of colleagues from the Czech Republic to host the 2014 ICAP in Prague. Dr. Drenth advances that a bid for 2014 be submitted by the Psychological Institute in the Netherlands. In a similar vein Dr. Roland-Levy stresses that the French Society of Psychology will submit a bid for 2014 in France.
